

Privacy Policy of IMC Challenge Sponsored by Huawei

The International Mathematics Competition for University Students (IMC) is organizing together with the company Huawei Technologies Co., Ltd. (hereafter referred to as “Huawei” or “we”), a company, whose registered office is located at Huawei Administration Building, Huawei Industrial Base, Bantian, Longgang District, Shenzhen, P.R. China 518129 an online Challenge called “IMC Challenge sponsored by Huawei” (hereafter referred to as “Challenge”).

The collection and processing of your personal data by Huawei are primarily intended to ensure that the Challenge will be properly completed. Huawei respects your privacy. Please read the following to learn more about our Privacy Policy ("this Policy") before participating.

This Policy describes how Huawei processes your personal data, but it may not address possible data processing scenarios of third parties like IMC.

1 How We Collect & Use Your Personal Data

You may provide and authorize us to collect your personal data through the following ways:

- 1) Personal data submitted and authorized by participants by registering the Challenge through Kattis platform.

2) Direct submission and authorization to us for prize-money payment.

We may use your personal data for the following purposes:

Huawei will process your personal data following the requirements of applicable laws on an appropriate legal basis, including:

- Processing your personal data to fulfill the contract when responding to a transaction or service request;
- Processing your personal data with your consent;
- Processing based on the legitimate interests of Huawei or a third party when we use your personal data to execute and improve our loss prevention and anti-fraud programs, and other purposes.
- Processing your personal data as necessary to comply with and fulfill legal obligations.

2. Cookies & Similar Technologies

2.1 Cookies

To ensure our website works correctly, we may at times place a small piece of data known as a cookie on your computer or mobile device. A cookie is a text file stored by a web server on a computer or mobile device. The content of a cookie can be retrieved or read only by the server that creates the cookie. The text in a cookie often consists of identifiers, site names, and some numbers and characters. Cookies are unique to the browsers or mobile applications you use, and enable websites to store data such as your preferences or items in your shopping cart.

Like many other websites or Internet service providers, Huawei uses cookies to improve user experience. Session cookies are deleted after each visit, while persistent cookies remain in place across multiple visits. Cookies allow websites to remember your settings such as language, font size on your computer or mobile device, or other browser preferences. This means that a user does not need to reset preferences for every visit. On the contrary, if cookies are not used, websites will treat you as a new visitor every time you load a web page. For example, if you are redirected to another web page from a website you are already logged in to and then return to the original website, it will not recognize you and you must log in again.

Huawei will not use cookies for any purposes not stated in this policy. For further details on our use of cookies, please see our Cookies Notice. You can manage or delete cookies based on your own preferences. For details, visit AboutCookies.org. You can clear all the cookies stored on your computer, and most web browsers provide the option of blocking cookies. 2.2 Web Beacons and Pixel Tags

In addition to cookies, we may also use other similar technologies on our websites such as web beacons and pixel tags. For example, when you receive an email from Huawei, it may contain a click-through URL that links to a Huawei web page. If you click the link, Huawei will track your visit to help us learn about your preferences for products and services and improve our customer service. A web beacon is a transparent graphic image embedded in a website or in an email. We use pixel tags in emails to find out whether an email has been opened. You can unsubscribe from the Huawei mailing list at any time if you do not want to be tracked in this manner.

By using our website, you consent to the use of cookies, web beacons and pixel tags as described above.

3. How We Disclose Personal Data

Huawei shares your personal data with other partners, as described in this Policy, when services are provided by partners authorized by Huawei.

Huawei generally does not disclose your personal information, except in the following scenarios:

As a global company, we may share your personal data with Huawei Technologies Co., Ltd.'s affiliates (see listed subsidiaries below). Such sharing is limited to specific, lawful purposes and only the necessary data. For example, if you are located in the EU, we may disclose personal information between Huawei's affiliates within the European Union.

All sharing is limited to the minimum necessary scope, and we take contractual and technical measures to ensure the security of your information.

In connection with the aforementioned disclosures and sharing, we will separately notify you of the identity of the recipient, the purpose and manner of processing, and the categories of personal data involved, and obtain your separate consent or take other legally required measures before such sharing occurs, where applicable under the law. Specific notification and consent requirements may vary depending on the nature of the recipient, the purpose of disclosure, and the requirements of applicable laws. Therefore, where applicable laws require only notification, we will provide the notification in an appropriate manner; where applicable laws require both notification and separate consent, we will obtain your separate consent before making any disclosure.

4. How to Access & Control Your Personal Data

It is your responsibility to ensure that all personal data submitted to Huawei is correct. Huawei is dedicated to maintaining the accuracy and completeness of personal data and keeping the data up-to-date.

To the extent required by applicable law, you may (i) have the right to access certain personal data we maintain about you, (ii) request that we update or correct inaccuracies in that data, (iii) object or restrict to our use of your personal data, and (iv) ask us to delete your personal data from our database. To exercise these rights, please [click here](#) to give your feedback online. Your written request may be required for security. We will verify your personal identity as required by local laws. We may decline the request if we have reasonable grounds to believe that the request is a fraudulent, unfeasible or may jeopardize the privacy of others.

If allowed by applicable laws, you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time when Huawei processes your personal data based on your consent. However, withdrawal does not affect the legitimacy and effectiveness of how we process your personal data based on your consent before the withdrawal is made; nor does it affect any data processing based on another justification other than your consent.

5. How We Protect Your Personal Data

Your personal data security is very important to us. We take appropriate physical, administrative, and technical measures to protect your personal data from unauthorized access, disclosure, use, modification, damage, or loss. For example, we use encryption technologies to ensure data confidentiality, adopt protective mechanisms to prevent attacks, and have access control mechanisms in place to allow only authorized personnel to access your personal data. We also provide our employees with training on security and privacy protection to enhance their awareness of personal data protection. We are committed to protecting your personal data; however, please note that no security measures are perfect.

In the unfortunate event of a personal data security incident, we will promptly notify you of the basic details of the incident, its potential impact, the measures we have taken or will take to address it, and recommendations to help you prevent or mitigate risks, in accordance with applicable laws and regulations. Such notifications may be provided via email, letter, phone call, push notification, or other appropriate means. If it is not possible to notify each affected individual individually, we will issue a public statement in a reasonable and effective manner. In addition, we

will proactively report the incident and its handling to relevant regulatory authorities in accordance with applicable laws or regulatory requirements.

To protect your personal information security and comply with regulatory requirements across different countries and regions, we adopt a regionally independent management approach:

1) Regional Independent Storage

Your personal information will be stored on servers located in the same region as your activity location or country/region. For example:

- China region data: Stored on servers within Mainland China.

- European region data: Stored on servers within Europe.

2) Regional Independent Control

Our regional teams independently manage personal information within their respective regions.

3) Access Permission Isolation

Only authorized employees within the corresponding region can access personal information stored in that region's servers based on business needs. Cross-region access is strictly prohibited.

4) Generally, No Cross-Region Sharing

Under normal circumstances, your personal information will not be transferred, shared, or cross-accessed between the aforementioned different regions. If in the future it becomes necessary to provide such information across regions due to your active application for positions in other regions, legal or regulatory requirements, dispute resolution, compliance audits, or other necessary reasons, we will separately fulfill the required notification, authorization, contractual arrangements, or other compliance procedures in accordance with applicable laws.

6. Your Rights in Personal Information Processing Activities

You shall ensure that all personal information submitted is accurate. Huawei will make reasonable efforts to maintain the accuracy and completeness of personal information and update such data in a timely manner.

Where required by applicable laws, you may have the right to:

(1) Access and obtain a copy of specific personal information we hold about you;

- (2) Request the update or correction of your inaccurate personal information;
- (3) Object to or restrict our use of your personal information;
- (4) Request the deletion of your personal information;
- (5) Request an explanation of the rules governing personal information processing.

To exercise these rights, please contact us via email at: challenge4IMC@huawei.com. For security purposes, you may be required to submit a written request. We will verify your identity in accordance with local legal requirements. We reserve the right to deny requests if we have reasonable grounds to believe they are fraudulent, unfeasible, or would infringe upon the privacy rights of others.

Where applicable laws require and where Huawei processes your personal information based on your consent, you further have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. However, such withdrawal shall not affect:

- The lawfulness and validity of any processing conducted prior to the withdrawal; or
- Our continued processing of your personal information based on other appropriate lawful grounds.

7. How Huawei Processes Personal Information of Minors Under 14 Years of Age

If you are a minor under the age of 14, please provide personal information to us only after obtaining consent from your parent or legal guardian. Where we collect personal information of minors with parental or guardian consent, we will only use or disclose such data when legally permitted, with explicit parental/guardian consent, or when necessary to protect the minor.

Should Huawei discover that it has collected personal information from a minor under 14 without prior verifiable parental/guardian consent, we will take measures to delete such data as soon as practicable.

8. Third-Party Providers and Their Services

To ensure a positive user experience, you may receive content or web links from third parties other than Huawei and its partners ("third parties"). Huawei does not have the right to control such

third parties, but you can choose whether to use the links, view the content and/or access the products or services provided by third parties.

Huawei cannot control the privacy practices and data protection policies of third parties that are not subject to this Policy. When you submit personal information to such a third party, please read and refer to the privacy protection policy of the third party.

9. International Transfers of Your Personal Data

As a multinational corporation, Huawei Technologies Co., Ltd. may enable access to your personal data by all affiliated entities within the Huawei group. Huawei shall ensure your data receives adequate protection as required by applicable laws and regulations, including implementing access whitelists and taking measures to guarantee processing complies with this Statement and local laws. Data protection laws vary across jurisdictions. In such cases, Huawei will implement safeguards to ensure data processing aligns with this Statement and applicable legal requirements.

Where specific legal requirements of certain jurisdictions apply, we will provide you with relevant data transfer information when necessary and obtain your consent where mandated by law. For instance: Under China's *Personal Information Protection Law (PIPL)*, we must disclose details of overseas recipients (including name and contact information), purpose and methods of processing, and obtain your separate consent before transferring your personal data outside China.

Additionally, when transferring EU data subjects' personal information to countries/regions not recognized by the EU as providing adequate data protection levels, Huawei employs legal mechanisms such as executing EU Commission-approved Standard Contractual Clauses (SCCs); obtaining explicit consent for cross-border transfers; or implementing security measures including but not limited to data anonymization prior to transfer.

10. Updates to This Policy

Huawei reserves the right to update or change this Policy at any time. We will release the latest Privacy Policy on this page for any changes. If major changes are made to the Privacy Policy, we

may notify you through different channels, for example, posting a notice on our website or sending you direct notification.

11. How to Contact Us

If you have any privacy-related complaints or inquiries, please email us at: challenge4IMC@huawei.com. We will generally respond within fifteen (15) working days. Should you believe that our processing of your personal information has infringed upon your legitimate rights and interests, and if we have failed to address your concern after your notification or you are dissatisfied with our response, you may further lodge a complaint or report with the relevant regulatory authorities, including but not limited to cyberspace administration, telecommunications, public security, and market supervision departments.
